

DIFFERENT IMMIGRATION ROUTES:

There are many different immigration routes, for example you can travel by boat or by plane.

Also there're some smugglers that will smuggle you for a big amount of money into the European Union.

DIFFERENT STAGES THEY GO THROUGH:

1. They have to leave their country, it may be difficult for them to leave there county if there are political issues. Perhaps they don't have the right papers. Perhaps they're not allowed to leave the country.

2. If they use smugglers to leave the country they need a lot of money. The journey is dangerous bye land (crossing deserts) and bye sea (danger of drowning).

3. They have to ask for a residence permit after they reached Europe. Not everyone gets one so easily because not everyone had the right reasons to ask for asylum.



4. They will get a temporarily residence permit and they can stay in an asylum centre, some family's may get separated.

5. They get a permanent residence permit, not everyone gets one so you may already have been in the Netherlands for a couple of years and then be denied and send back to where you're came from.

Children from migrants that grew up in The Netherlands are fully adapted to living in our country but are alienated in their parents' home land if they're send back.

DIFFERENT KIND OF REFUGEES

1. Political refugees, they will go because of war or because they've no freedom of speech in their country. There is also a possibility that they're searched for because of religious reasons.
- 2.. economic refugees, they will go because they don't earn enough money to feed their own family or to buy a house, they think that in The Netherlands they can earn way more money.
3. Climate refugees, they will go because of earthquakes and other disasters created by nature.

ORIGIN COUNTRIES

Refugees in the Netherlands come from many different countries for example 2,3% of our students come from China and there're also a lot of students from Iraq, Indonesia, Turkey, Morocco and Pakistan. These're the countries our school has most migrants from.
